Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will be with the Lord forever. Therefore encourage one another with these words.

Jesus, the way and the truth and the life, you drew your disciple Thomas from doubt to faith: Reveal the resurrection faith to the doubting and the lost.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord; who rose victorious from the dead, and comforts us with the blessed hope of everlasting life. For to your faithful people, O Lord, life is changed, not ended; and when our mortal body lies in death, there is prepared for us a dwelling place eternal in the heavens. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

All *Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might,*
 heaven and earth are full of your glory.
 Hosanna in the highest.
 Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord.

Celebrant We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. For in these last days you sent Jesus to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In Christ, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In Christ, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

All *We remember Christ's death,*
We proclaim Christ's resurrection,
We await Christ's coming in glory;

Celebrant And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Savior of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, through whom we are acceptable to you, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with the Blessed Virgin Mary and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your children; through Jesus Christ our Savior, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

Remember also, O Lord, the souls of your servants who have gone before us, bearing the sign of faith, and who sleep the sleep of peace. To them, O Lord, and to all who rest in Christ, grant, we pray, a place of refreshment, light and peace, beside the waters of comfort, in that paradise where there is neither sorrow nor sighing. In the glorious light of your countenance, O God, and of all your saints, grant unto them, we pray, every fulfillment of your promised good: the things unimaginable to us that, nevertheless, you have prepared for all who love you. And in your great mercy, grant that we, with all your servants and saints, may finally enter the blessed light that shines perpetually upon all who die in you.

By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. *AMEN.*

The LORD'S PRAYER

Celebrant And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say

All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The FRACTION

A period of silence is kept

Celebrant Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

People *Therefore, let us keep the feast. Alleluia!*

The MINISTRATION of COMMUNION

Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the blessed Bread and Wine of Holy Communion at the Lord's Table. Hold out your hands for the Bread. Gluten-free Bread is available; simply inform the priest you desire it. If you wish to drink the Wine, consume the Bread when you receive it and drink from the chalice when it is presented to you. If you wish to have Bread dipped in the Wine, let the Bread remain in your hands; the chalice bearer will intinct it for you. If you wish to come forward to receive a blessing rather than the Bread and Wine, indicate that desire by crossing your arms over your chest. If it is difficult for you to come forward, inform an usher, and the Bread and Wine will be brought to you.

Be present, be present, O Jesus, our great High Priest, as you were present with your disciples, and be known to us in the breaking of bread; who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.

The Kontakion of the Departed

The Kontakion is from the ancient Byzantine tradition; a form of it is now found in the Burial Service in The Book of Common Prayer

Celebrant Give rest, O Christ, to your servant with your saints,
People *where sorrow and pain are no more,
neither sighing, but life everlasting.*

You only are immortal, the creator and maker of mankind; and we are mortal, formed of the earth, and unto earth shall we return. For so did you ordain when you created me, saying, “You are dust, and to dust you shall return.” All of us go down to the dust; yet even at the grave we make our song: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

*Give rest, O Christ, to your servants with your saints,
where sorrow and pain are no more,
neither sighing, but life everlasting.*

Celebrant Let us pray.

Hear us, O merciful Savior, as we remember in love those whom we have placed in your hands. Acknowledge, we humbly beseech you, sheep of your own fold, lambs of your own flock, sinners of your own redeeming. Receive them into the arms of your mercy, into the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and into the glorious company of the saints in light. *Amen.*

The Properties Commission is very satisfied with all the progress, and we look forward to opening this new space to the parish and the wider community soon.

Bible Study on Tuesdays

Are you looking for a place to learn more about the Bible? a time to have meaningful discussions about faith and doctrine? an hour a week of good fellowship? Well, how about all three?!?

Join us at our *weekly Tuesday Bible study*, at 12:00 (both in-person and on Zoom; the link is on our main web page). This year, Fr Douglas will lead us in exploring the Gospel according to St Luke (and we'll probably get started on the Acts of the Apostles, too). It helps to study the chapter in advance ... and Douglas can recommend a helpful, accessible commentary if you'd like. But the most important part is just coming and sharing as we dive more deeply into the Good News of Christ.

Looking Back / Looking Ahead

Sunday sermons may spark questions ... inspire musings ... or sometimes seem just plain wrong, but our worship style doesn't allow for any real dialogue. So, Fr Douglas hosts a Zoom meeting (the link is on our main web page) *every Monday evening at 7:00* where we can **look back** at the previous day's sermon. And then we'll take a **look ahead** at the next Sunday's readings—history, interpretation, meaning for our lives—so we can ponder this a bit before we hear them in worship.
