




JANUARY E-BLAST



Showers of Blessings

Providing showers for our unsheltered neighbors at the Episcopal Community

Center in Ocean Beach on the last Saturday morning of the month. Think of how showers can add to the self esteem and job prospects of those on the street.

Donate items needed for the showers, such as

- Large bottles of shampoo
- Large bottles of body wash
- Wash clothes (clean, used ok)
- Clorox clean up spray- cleaner plus bleach
- Lysol spray disinfectant
- Boxes of disposable face masks
- Boxes of Latex-free disposable gloves- size Large and XL.

Items can be left in the narthex of the church, or in the church office.

Opportunities to Help Afghan Refugees

The Outreach Committee has been in touch with two organizations which are working together to welcome and give assistance to Afghan refugees being sent to San Diego.

Hope for San Diego

(www.hopeforsd.org) is working with World Relief of Southern California (worldreliefsocal.org) and has been sending us weekly information about opportunities such as to help furnish and set up apartments, and shop for middle eastern foods for refugee families. This information has been coming out just a day or two in advance of when the help is needed. I would like to put together an e-mail list of folks in our parish who would be interested in helping out, so I can notify them right away.

A Statement of Commitment
