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A note from Ruben concerning today's music

For my final Sunday as Director of Music and Organist I've chosen music and texts that deeply resonate with me, and with my work with the choirs of this beloved parish. In particular, let me briefly highlight the choir's two anthems and the Mass.

The *Missa Brevis* by G P da Palestrina is simply a favorite of the choir, and one which we offered up many times over the last decade. Whether we sang it on Christmas Eve, Easter Day or a mid-week observance, I always enjoyed diving into this music with a new set of eyes and ears, always finding new ways to shape its many phrases. From the elegant opening Kyrie Eleison, through to the magical Agnus Dei II with its spellbinding canon in the divided soprano part, this work was always at the core of our work together.

Then, Herbert Howells' rhapsodic *A Hymn for St Cecilia*, set to a text by Ursula Vaughan Williams (yes, wife of Ralph Vaughan Williams). Given the fact that some of the greatest English poets wrote works in honor of St Cecilia (including John Dryden and W H Auden, among them), it must have taken courage to add one's name to this list. Of course, St Cecilia's presence as the patron saint of music had to be invoked somewhere in today's proceedings! Let me share one line of text that always leaps out at me:

*Through the cold aftermath of centuries,
Cecilia's music dances in the skies;
lend us a fragment of the immortal air,
that with your choiring angels we may share.*

And finally, Healey Willan's mystical *Behold, the Tabernacle of God*, with the text taken from A Feast of Dedication for a church. Indeed, this is my tip of the hat to this incredible parish, and it is the profound final two lines of text that encapsulates my feelings for THIS place:

O how dreadful is this place, this is the house of God,
and this is the gate of heaven.*

* Dreadful: inspiring reverence and awe.

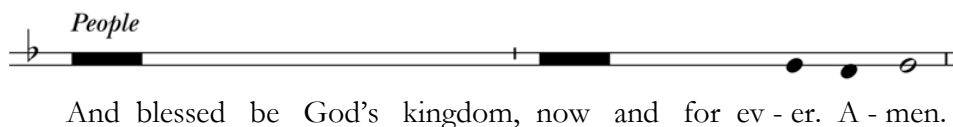
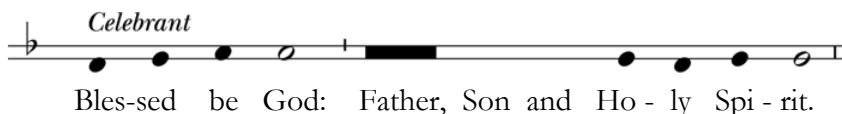

The SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 1:10-18

Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you but that you be knit together

in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been made clear to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else. For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel—and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the gentiles—
the people who sat in darkness
have seen a great light,

From that time Jesus began to proclaim, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.”

As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishers. And he said to them, “Follow me, and I will make you fishers of people.” Immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

Jesus went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

We celebrate Christ’s death and resurrection as we await the day of his coming.

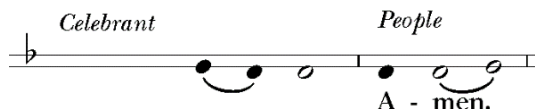
Therefore, O God, we who have been redeemed by Jesus Christ, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before you these gifts.

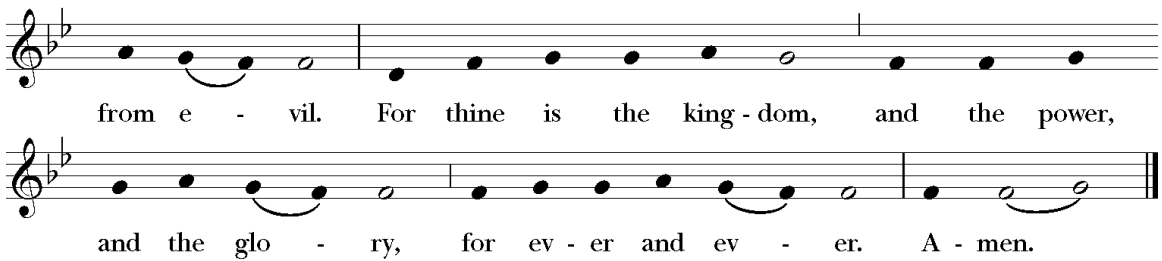

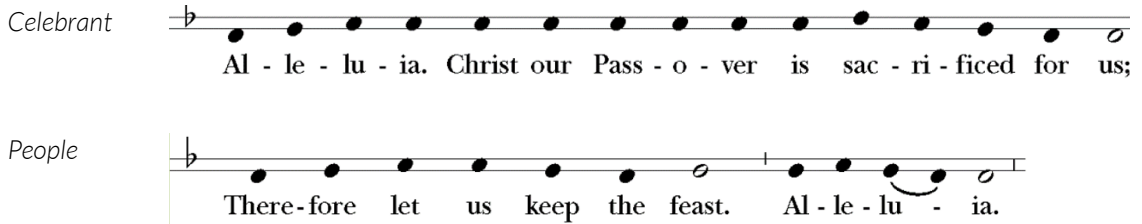

The MINISTRATION of COMMUNION

Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the blessed Bread and Wine of Holy Communion at the Lord's Table. Hold out your hands for the Bread. Gluten-free Bread is available; simply inform the priest you desire it. If you wish to drink the Wine, consume the Bread when you receive it and drink from the chalice when it is presented to you. If you wish to have Bread dipped in the Wine, let the Bread remain in your hands; the chalice bearer will intinct it for you. If you wish to come forward to receive a blessing rather than the Bread and Wine, indicate that desire by crossing your arms over your chest. If it is difficult for you to come forward, inform an usher, and the Bread and Wine will be brought to you.
