THE BAPTISM

Each Candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then pours water upon the Candidate, saying

N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

The Priest places a hand on the Baptizand's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross with Chrism that has previously been blessed by the Bishop, and saying

N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen.*

The Priest prays over the Baptizands, saying

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them inquiring and discerning hearts, the courage to will and to persevere, spirits to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen.*

A candle, lighted from the Paschal Candle, is given to each candidate (or a Parent or Godparent), the Priest saying

Receive the light of Christ as a sign that N. has passed from darkness into light. May N. shine as Christ's light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

The Priest blesses the Baptizands' family, saying

May God the Father, who by Baptism adopts us as God's children, grant you peace. *Amen.*

May God the Son, who sanctified a home in Nazareth, fill you with love. *Amen.*

May God the Holy Spirit, who has made the Church one family, keep you in peace. *Amen.*

The baptismal party makes a procession to the Altar, the Celebrant asperging (sprinkling) the People with the Water, as all sing

HYMN 504 *Come, Holy Spirit, our souls inspire*

VENI CREATOR SPIRITUS

The Celebrant addresses the People, saying

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

Celebrant

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and

said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

The MINISTRATION of COMMUNION

Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the blessed Bread and Wine of Holy Communion at the Lord's Table. To receive, come forward to the Altar rail when the usher indicates and either kneel or stand. Hold out your hands for the Bread. If you wish to have Bread dipped in the Wine, let the Bread remain in your hands; the chalice bearer will intinct it for you. If you wish to drink the Wine, consume the Bread when you receive it and drink from the chalice when it is presented to you. If you wish to come forward to receive a blessing rather than the Bread and Wine, indicate that desire by crossing your arms over your chest.

Today's Music

Today's closing voluntary, *Prelude in F*, is by Fanny Mendelssohn Hensel (1805-1847), sister of Felix Mendelssohn. Fanny learned piano from an early age from her mother who had in turn been taught by a student of J. S. Bach. As a young child Fanny was acknowledged as a prodigy with a very promising future as a musician. Although Fanny's father was tolerant of her pursuit of music, he firmly stated in 1820, "Music will perhaps become his [Felix's] profession, while for you [Fanny] it can and must be only an ornament." As a result, many of Fanny's compositions were initially published under Felix's name, resulting in Fanny being somewhat of an invisible and unknown composer until recent times. The *Prelude in F* was composed for her own wedding in 1829.
