Dear Parents,

All Souls' Youth Group is excited to announce that we will be going on a mission trip to Belize next summer! The dates for our trip will be June 30 through July 10, 2017.

We will fly from Los Angeles and spend a full day in transit before reaching our destination of San Pedro, Belize. When we arrive, we will explore the island and enjoy its tropical beaches for the weekend before we begin our week of service at Holy Cross Anglican School. After we finish our work on Friday, we will travel to the mainland and explore local history, rainforests, and Mayan ruins before returning to the United States.

Accommodations will be provided at a local hostel in San Pedro and the Diocesan Guest House in Belize City. Numerous mission teams have stayed at these locations in the past, and the school assures us that they are safe, reasonably comfortable, and affordable.

The cost of our trip will be roughly \$1500 per person, including airfare. If we each do our part in fundraising, we anticipate that families will contribute no more than half of the final cost of the trip.

Enclosed is an informational packet about our trip, including an application and membership covenant. Space is limited, and we ask that you return the application and covenant to the church office no later than Tuesday, September 6, along with a \$200 deposit to secure your young person's spot on the team.

We sincerely hope that your son or daughter will join us in Belize next summer. I am excited about this opportunity for our youth group, and I look forward to preparing for this experience together in the coming months.

Holy Cross Anglican School



Holy Cross Anglican Primary School is located on the beautiful island of Ambergris Caye, Belize. Founded in September 2006, our school educates 440 students from preschool to Standard 6 (8th grade). This is not your typical school, though it may look so from the outside. What makes us different?

- 1 **Our Community.** Our school is located in – and draws many of its students from – the incredibly poor neighborhood of [San Mateo](#), which at one time won the dubious honor of being recognized as the most at risk community in all of Belize by the Red Cross. At risk of what, you ask? Well... everything the Red Cross was measuring risk of, be it risk of hurricane, risk of fire or risk of disease. This means many of our families face incredible need and, though hard working, often struggle to provide the necessities for their children.
- 2 **What we offer our students:** We don't just provide an education; we seek to provide an [excellent education](#) that meets the needs of the modern world. We have a computer lab, a well-stocked library and strive to provide excellent resources for our teachers. We also provide for the health of our students, by providing a nutritious lunch, [dental care](#) and volunteer doctors. Finally, for those who cannot afford their own, we provide the pencils, paper, shoes, [scholarships](#) and more so they can attend school.
- 3 **We embrace visitors & volunteers:** What we have to offer, we can only give because it was given to us first, so we rely heavily on [donations](#). Our school was built and is maintained by [volunteers](#) and all of our [school supplies](#) that we provide to our students are donated by visiting families and individuals. So if you are coming to the island – or you know someone who is – please have them contact us to arrange a [visit](#). We'd love to meet you.

You'd expect a school like this to have a great story behind it. And we do. Great people too. The school was founded in 2006 by Francis and Vernon Wilson, two missionaries from Virginia, USA who were working in Belize City. They saw the incredible need for a new school in San Pedro – the existing schools were full and then some – and, unlike many who would have just felt sad about the need, they did something about it. Other Helpful Information

Special Diets

Vegetarian food is available, but lacking in variety. Rice and beans, beans and rice!

Gluten-free options are minimal. Many restaurants serve flour tortillas and they are often mixed into the rest of the food. The best gluten-free option is preparing your own meals.

Cell Phones

Not all plans work in San Pedro, and those that do are quite expensive. We may consider renting a cell phone for \$5/day (plus the cost of calls) with a reserved number, so that parents have a number to call in an emergency.

Internet

Computers are accessible during the day at the school when the computer lab instructor is present. There is free wi-fi at the hostel in San Pedro.

Currency

There is no need to exchange currency, as US dollars spend just fine. The conversion rate is \$1US = \$2 Belize.

Dress

Please dress more modestly while at school than you might in the US. Shorts/skirts should come at least midway down the thigh, though preferably closer to the knee. Shoulders and midribs must be covered, and shoes and shirt must be worn at all times on school property.

Vaccinations

No specific vaccinations are required for travel to Belize. However, it is preferable to ensure you are up to date on all childhood immunizations (MMR, DPT, etc), as well as tetanus, Hepatitis A/B, and chicken pox.

Malaria

Not present in Belize City or San Pedro. The only time we might come into contact with malaria is in the jungle or on trips to Mayan ruins. As this is only for a few hours at a time, a generous application of insect repellent PRIOR to entering these areas is generally sufficient.
